TACKLING YOUR ISSUES

The Monmouthshire Neighbourhood Policing Team is working with partners to tackle the issues that you have raised as a part of PACT.

Following the last Monmouthshire Partnerships and Communities Together (PACT) meeting, the Neighbourhood Policing Team has been working with partners to address the following priorities:

YOU SAID: Thefts and rural burglaries

WE DID: An operation is ongoing across Monmouthshire and Torfaen to target known burglary suspects. As part of this operation, multiple search warrants were carried out on 27th May at properties across Monmouthshire. Several people were arrested and remain on police bail for suspicion of burglary. A large amount of property was recovered and enquiries are ongoing to trace the owners.

On Friday 28th May, two suspects were spotted by an Abergavenny resident acting suspiciously. The police were called and both people were arrested for attempting to break into a local house. We would like to thank the local community for the information that they gave to us which resulted in a good arrest. If anyone can help us with any further information about burglaries or rural thefts, please contact us in the Neighbourhood Office.

On 18th June we carried out an operation with the town centre shops to raise staff awareness about the security of shop stock and personal belongings, as well as getting all the shops to communicate through the store-net radio system. The operation was a great success with all stores working together to identify suspicious individuals. We would like to say a big thank you to all stores that participated.

OWL (Online Watch Link) is a way for police & communities to utilise the potential of Neighbourhood Watch, School Watch, Business Watch and many other watch schemes.



The system is due to be launched in Monmouthshire around September 2010. OWL provides the opportunity to send out the latest messages and crime alerts to all members of the community signed up to the scheme by email, phone message or text. In addition to the two way communication methods other key features include:-

- Display of contact information for their street coordinator, area coordinator, ward coordinator.
- Shows local police station, Neighbourhood Police officer/PCSO and their office/mobile number if available, and links to local NHW and local & county police websites.
- A "Fix My Street" application that allows watch members to easily report problems to local councils such as broken street lights and paving stones, graffiti, etc. The most recent reports submitted to their council are displayed with a map showing the exact location of the problem. This feature helps improve quality of life in communities and councils are actively supporting it in other areas of the Country.
- Crime Maps - Compliments and builds on existing crime mapping provided by Gwent Police. The charts exclusively created for OWL use the latest official crime data to provide a visual comparison of crime across districts putting local data into context offering the public a better understanding.
- "Where is my nearest..." provides a list of local professional services that may be required after an incident. Details are shown with an interactive map to show the location of nearby doctors, electricians, glaziers, locksmiths, plumbers, etc.

Anti-social behaviour crack down in Abergavenny

On Thursday 15th and Friday 16th July we targeted off road bikes and underage drinking.

On Thursday, officers focussed on off road bikes and anti-social driving throughout Abergavenny. The aim of the operation was to seize any illegal bikes but also to speak to young people and drivers about the impact that their behaviour has on the community.

Police Community Support Officer Craig Gadd who organised the operation said, "Our local communities have told us that off road bikes are a concern for them and we wanted to make it clear to illegal and anti-social drivers that their behaviour is unacceptable."

A total of 5 bikes were seized and one young person was given a final warning for driving without a helmet. Other drivers stopped have been summoned to appear in court for a variety of driving offences.

On the second day of the operation, officers focussed on underage drinking on Castle Meadows and the Cattle Market. Police Constable Ruth Hanney led the operation. She explained, "As it was the last day of school we wanted to stop any problems before they took place. "

Forty young people were stopped and spoken to and 45 cans and bottles of alcohol were seized.

PC Hanney added, "Over the last year, our anti-social behaviour levels in Monmouthshire have decreased by 12% but we are working hard to decrease anti-social incidents even further."
