Crime update for Monmouth

The average number of crimes in this area has increased from **69.7 to 77 (10.5%)** (compared to the same three month period last year)

The level of crime is average compared to the rest of the Gwent area. We have been working hard to decrease the crime rate in Monmouth. Please see our crime update stories on pages 3 and 4 to see what we are doing in this area.

8 ARRESTED FOLLOWING DAWN RAIDS

Gwent Police raided six separate properties across Gwent on Wednesday May 26th as part of a co-ordinated crackdown on an organised crime group which is believed to have been operating in the area. Whilst the six addresses were searched Gwent officers also travelled to the Gloucestershire and South Wales Police areas to carry out additional warrants. Metropolitan Police officers also carried out a warrant in their area as part the on-going investigation into a number vehicle thefts and burglaries which have occurred mainly in Gwent.

Operation Safari involved 80 Gwent officers including specialist dog handlers, local policing teams, Detectives, Gwent Police Support Group and Financial Investigators from the Regional Asset Recovery Team (RART). Four suspected stolen vehicles, a large amount of vehicle parts and over £30000 were seized.

Detective Inspector Simon Thomas who led the operation commented:

"This is the first phase of an ongoing investigation to dismantle a suspected organised crime group operating in and around the Gwent area. We believe the group has been targeting high value vehicles and have also been involved in other criminal activity. We expect further arrests to follow as we link offences together and build a more complete picture of the suspected criminal activity.

"This activity demonstrates that when we have credible intelligence we will act on it."

MONMOUTH CRIMINALS TARGETED IN MONTH LONG OPERATION

Monmouth Neighbourhood Policing team have targeted criminal activity in the town centre in an ongoing operation over the last month.

A team of officers have pro-actively concentrated their efforts on the town centre to halt a growing trend of shop breaks and criminal damage. The team have also been focussing on anti-social behaviour and graffiti which are PACT (Partnerships and Communities Together) priorities for the town centre wards.

In total since the operation has started, officers have made 33 arrests for a variety of offences such as criminal damage, theft and public order offences. In addition to these arrests, over 40 stop and searches have been carried out on people and vehicles.

Overall crime levels in Monmouthshire have dropped over the last month by 33 incidents and anti-social behaviour rates over the last year have decreased by 3.4% (156 incidents).

Monmouth Neighbourhood Sergeant Dick Bull said, 'This pro-active approach will hopefully reassure the public of Monmouth that we are committed to addressing the type of behaviour which can seriously affect our local businesses and the quality of life of local community.

'Our officers have had great success during the last month. We are continuing with this operation and will be widening our work over the coming months to encompass the surrounding areas of the town and more rural areas.'
