TACKLING YOUR ISSUES

Following the last Monmouthshire Partnerships and Communities Together (PACT) meeting, the Neighbourhood Policing Team has been working with partners to address the following priorities:

YOU SAID: Speeding – Berthon Road, Little Mill

WE DID:

We have continued to carry out speed checks along Berthon Road. We have been using the digital speed device which illuminates the speed of vehicles as they approach and pass it. The device has the effect of both educating drivers of their speed and slowing them down.

We have also been giving out road safety leaflets at all of our surgeries and summer events. This is to try and educate drivers about the dangers of speeding and the need to drive safely.

Don't advertise your goods to thieves ...

There have been a few instances through the summer where items have been stolen from vehicles in Goytre Wharf car park. In these instances the vehicles were either left unlocked or valuable items were left in full view. Even if you think you are only going to leave your vehicle for a short time please remember to lock your vehicle and put all items into the boot out of sight.

OWL (Online Watch Link) is a way for police & communities to utilise the potential of Neighbourhood Watch, School Watch, Business Watch and many other watch schemes.



The system is due to be launched in Monmouthshire around September 2010. OWL provides the opportunity to send out the latest messages and crime alerts to all members of the community signed up to the scheme by email, phone message or text. In addition to the two way communication methods other key features include:-

- Display of contact information for their street coordinator, area coordinator, ward coordinator.
- Shows local police station, Neighbourhood Police officer/PCSO and their office/mobile number if available, and links to local NHW and local & county police websites.
- A "Fix My Street" application that allows watch members to easily report problems to local councils such as broken street lights and paving stones, graffiti, etc. The most recent reports submitted to their council are displayed with a map showing the exact location of the problem. This feature helps improve quality of life in communities and councils are actively supporting it in other areas of the Country.
- Crime Maps - Compliments and builds on existing crime mapping provided by Gwent Police. The charts exclusively created for OWL use the latest official crime data to provide a visual comparison of crime across districts putting local data into context offering the public a better understanding.
- "Where is my nearest..." provides a list of local professional services that may be required after an incident. Details are shown with an interactive map to show the location of nearby doctors, electricians, glaziers, locksmiths, plumbers, etc.

USK OFFICERS HAVE A DOUBLE DECKER PACT MEETING

The neighbourhood team in Usk decided to try a new way of attracting people to their quarterly Partnerships and Communities Together (PACT) meetings.

With the help of the Raglan based company Londonbus4hire, the officers held their PACT meeting on Tuesday 6th July free of charge on a red double decker London bus.

Over 60 people completed forms during the morning meeting, stating what they felt was the one main priority that needed addressing in their neighbourhoods. The results of these forms have now been collated and the new priorities for Usk are;

- HGV lorries driving through the town
- Illegal parking throughout Usk

Police Constable Mike Thomas who works at Usk station said, "We wanted to encourage local residents to come along to our PACT meetings to let us know about the issues that are affecting them most.

"By holding our meetings on a double decker bus, people were intrigued about what was happening which gave us an opportunity to talk to them. We were pleased with the response from the public and will be working hard over the next quarter to address the priority issues raised."

PC Thomas added, "We'd like to thanks Martin Detheridge, the owner of Londonbus4hire who kindly loaned his bus to us free of charge."
