Dear requester,

Thank you for your recent request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Section 1 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) places two duties on public authorities. Unless exemptions apply, the first duty at, **Section 1(1) (a)**, is to confirm or deny whether the information specified in a request is held. The second duty at, **Section 1 (1) (b)**, is to disclose information that has been confirmed as being held.

The information that you are seeking is in relation to the following:

REQUEST

For each of these crime types, can you please let me know the total number of offences that were committed by those who are not British born for each of the last five years:

- Robbery
- Theft
- Burglary
- Sexual offences
- Violence against the person

Please display this data both as a raw number and that raw number displayed as a percentage of all offences committed of that offence type (i.e. offences committed by both British-born and foreign-born offenders).

CLARIFICATION NEEDED FROM REQUESTOR:

Can we clarify with the requestor if they are after arrest data or crime data please?

CLARIFICATION RECEIVED:

Crime data please.

RESPONSE

The time frame for this crime data is 01/01/2020 to 11/08/2025.

Nationality is based on the officers inputting the correct information into the system.



The information provided is based on the number of offenders linked to a crime. There may be duplicates in the count if they have been listed as a suspect for multiple offences. For example, a person was linked as an offender for robbery in Jan 2020 and then again for robbery in Jan 2021 – they will be counted twice. There also could be multiple offenders linked to one reference, each offender will be included in the count.

Please note, every effort is made to ensure that the figures presented are accurate and complete.

Freedom of Information Act is a public disclosure regime, not a private regime. Any information disclosed under the Act is thereafter deemed to be in the public domain, and therefore freely available to the public and will be published on the Gwent Police website.

If, upon receiving a response to a freedom of information request, you are unhappy with the outcome, you may request an internal review. **This should be made within 40 working days of the initial response.**
