Dear requester,

Thank you for your recent request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Section 1 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) places two duties on public authorities. Unless exemptions apply, the first duty at, **Section 1(1) (a)**, is to confirm or deny whether the information specified in a request is held. The second duty at, **Section 1 (1) (b)**, is to disclose information that has been confirmed as being held.

The information that you are seeking is in relation to the following:

REQUEST

Please provide me with the number of all reported crimes (broken down by each offence type), where the location of the alleged offence or the address of the victim was recorded as one of the following locations:

- 1. Roadchef Magor Services, M4, Magor, Monmouthshire, NP26 3YL**

Please provide figures for 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024. Please provide the figures in a table listing each crime type (eg theft from a motor vehicle, criminal damage etc) against each year.

- 2. For theft from motor vehicle, please also provide figures where the value of the theft exceeds £20,000 for each year.**

Please also advise and assist, under the Section 16 obligations of the Act, as to how I can refine my request if needed.

If cost is an issue under Section 12, please place priority on 2024 data and work backwards as far as cost permits, there is no need to seek clarification on this.

RESPONSE

Q1. The table provides all recorded offences where the postcode of the offence location was NP26 3YL and the street linked was 'Magor interchange', broken down by year.

Q2. Of the offences listed in question 1, there were 11 'Theft from a motor vehicle' offences. Each record was then checked to see if the value of the stolen items exceeded £20,000. There were no records which exceeded £20,000; however, some records did not disclose the value of the stolen items.
