## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST 2024/27774

Dear requester,

Thank you for your recent request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

**Section 1** of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) places two duties on public authorities. Unless exemptions apply, the first duty at, **Section 1(1) (a)**, is to confirm or deny whether the information specified in a request is held. The second duty at, **Section1 (1) (b)**, is to disclose information that has been confirmed as being held.

The information that you are seeking is in relation to the following:

## **REQUEST**

- Since October 2023, how much money has been spent by your police force on the Dangerous Dogs Act if possible broken down by:
- o How much money has been spent on kennelling seized dogs?
- o How much has been spent on Vet fees for seized dogs?
- o If relevant, any other costs incurred for seized dogs?

## **RESPONSE**

Kennelling costs - £403,897.23

Vet fees - £18,332.88

Please note, every effort is made to ensure that the figures presented are accurate and complete.

Freedom of Information Act is a public disclosure regime, not a private regime. Any information disclosed under the Act is thereafter deemed to be in the public domain, and therefore freely available to the public and will be published on the Gwent Police website.

If, upon receiving a response to a freedom of information request, you are unhappy with the outcome, you may request an internal review. This should be made within 40 working days of the initial response.
